**1.0 Speedwatch Scheme**

- 1.1 Community Speedwatch is a national initiative where members of local communities, with the support and supervision of their local police, record details of speeding vehicles using approved detection devices.
- 1.2 Registered keepers of vehicles breaking the speed limit are contacted by letter explaining the potential risks and consequences of their dangerous behaviour.
- 1.3 Repeat offenders receive a visit from the local police and could face criminal prosecution.
